BALANCING THE BOOKS

These are clearly tough economic times - and the Council is no exception. But Ed and the Léeds Greens have been pushing for improvements to the city's budget - with some success.

We first proposed a Tourist Levy and Workplace Parking Levy, as fair proposals that would boost funding for our communities - and both aré now under consideration. **We've also been pushing for growth** within the reuse economy, such as the popular 'Revive' reuse stores, to raise further income. And we're calling to reduce the salaries of top-earning executives.

However, as Ed says: "We're battling hard for a steady and just economy - but are **baffled and disappointed that the national Labour government is** doubling down on the toxic economics of austerity. They are bleeding us dry. There is another way - but only if the political will is there
